




Getting to know Gakino'amaage: Teach For Canada

Gakino'amaage partners with First Nations to recruit, prepare, and support committed educators. By addressing the unique needs of partners, we develop community-led programs that enhance First Nations capacity, supporting the long-term sustainability of generations of Indigenous students and leaders.



RECRUIT

Gakino'amaage recruits certified teachers based on selection criteria designed by First Nations leaders. This ensures that educators have the skills and aptitude to meaningfully contribute to northern classrooms.



PREPARE

Teachers participate in an intensive preparation program focused on First Nations histories, cultures, and pedagogies. Concurrently, educators in school leadership roles benefit from an Administrator Preparation Program.



SUPPORT

During their first two years in the North, certified teachers and principals receive personal and professional support, and access a peer network to help them thrive in the classroom and community.



SUSTAIN

Gakino'amaage's community-led programming builds community capacity to increase the supply and retention of local certified teachers and teacher assistants in northern First Nations.
