Rainbow District School Board offers English and French Immersion programs from Kindergarten to Grade 12 in Sudbury, Espanola and Manitoulin Island.




Mission: *Together, we prepare students to become lifelong learners, achieving their full potential as confident, caring members of society.*

Vision: *We bring learning to life, enabling students to fulfill their aspirations.*








- Co-operative Education, integrating secondary school classroom theory with practical experience alongside an employer




Staff participate and organize various school-based initiatives and activities aimed to nurture the physical, social and mental well-being of students.


Rainbow District School Board recognizes the importance of learning a second language.

Elementary Schools

In French Immersion, students learn to communicate and interact effectively in an inclusive classroom environment and through the study and integration of other subjects. This enriches their vocabulary, develops their problem solving skills, and increases their opportunities to speak French in meaningful contexts.

French Immersion provides students with an understanding of intercultural awareness by exploring diverse cultures and develops skills in accessing and understanding information about various French speaking communities. Students also develop strong fundamental skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing.

On the map




Rainbow District School Board covers a geographic area of more than 14,757 square kilometers in the heart of Rainbow Country.




